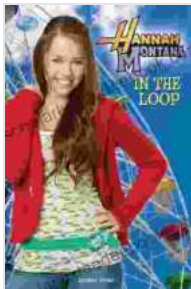


Hannah Montana in the Loop: A Pop Princess Embraces Diversity and Inclusion

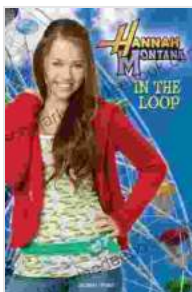

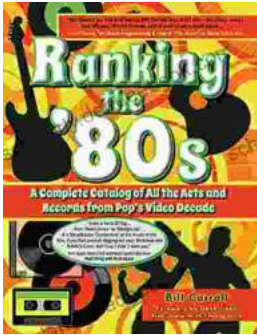
