

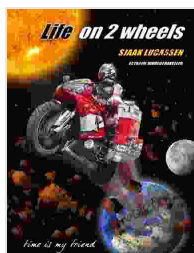
# Life on Wheels: Parting Out of North America Until the End

## **Tips for RV Life**

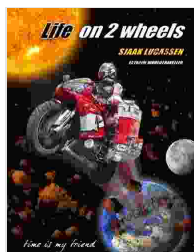
If you are considering RV life, here are a few tips:

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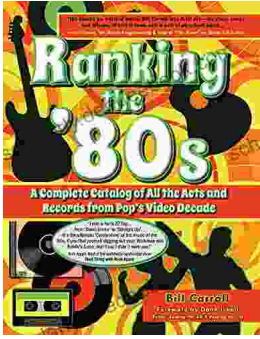
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
