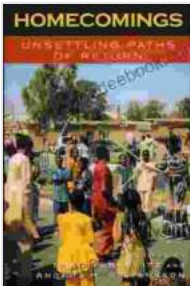

- Non-profit organizations
- Government agencies
- International organizations
- Research institutions
- Academia

Application Process

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree in a related field, such as social work, sociology, political science, or economics.

Applicants must also have a strong interest in migration and refugee issues and a commitment to social justice.

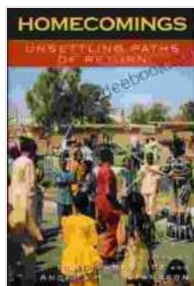
The application deadline is January 15th.

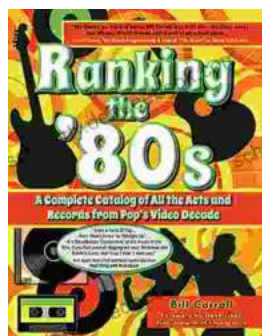
